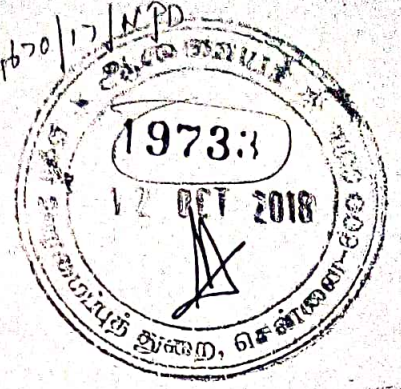
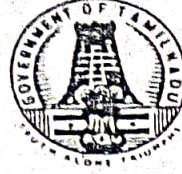

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ABSTRACT

Karur Municipality - Formation of link road from Karur Railway Station to NH-7- Sanction of Rs. 21.12 Crore under Infrastructure and Amenities fund - Orders - Issued.

ORDER:-

In the letter first read above, the Commissioner of Town and Country Planning has stated that a proposal seeking funds amounting to Rs. 21.12 Crore under Infrastructure and Amenities fund has been received from the Commissioner of Municipal Administration for the following project :

2. Further, the Commissioner of Town and Country Planning has stated as follows:-

- Karur Municipality, a special grade municipality, situated at the junction of National Highway (NH7) and Trichy - Coimbatore National

Highway. It is home to many industries like Textiles processing industries, Bus-body building industries and mosquito net knitting industries etc, with huge market potential for exports. The existing production capacity is Rs. 4000 Crore per annum.

- The Commissioner, Karur Municipality has suggested a new road by adjoining nearby existing 17 cross roads with provisions for street lighting and drainage facilities at an estimated cost of Rs.33.28 Crores and the work to be taken up in two phases.
- The Commissioner, Karur Municipality has taken steps to procure land from public and by this 80% of land i.e., 1147.00 m in length is now in possession of Karur Municipality. The Karur Commissioner has also stated that steps are being taken by him to procure the remaining 20% of land i.e., 118.36m from HR&CE, 340.67 Mts from private parties. In this juncture Karur Commissioner submitted revised proposal for implementing the project at an estimated cost of Rs. 21.12 Crore i.e., 3.12 Crores for procuring the land and Rs. 18.00 Crore for making infra work and requested the entire fund as grant from Infrastructure and Amenities fund.
- The long felt necessity of the people, exporters and industrialists of this town is to improve the materials transportation and labour movement from Karur Railway Junction to NH7 via Central Business District. Around 60,000 to 70,000 people will be benefits daily by this link road. This road links Inamkarur, Kulathupalayam, Periyar Nagar, MG Road, Ramakrishnapuram, Kamarajapuram, Senguthapuram areas, along the stretch.
- The Commissioner of Municipal Administration has stated that the proposed link road runs 20 meters south side and parallel to the railway line having embankment of around 2.0 meters height (nearly 7 feet) and the distance between the site selected for the proposed link road and the railway line is nearly 20 meters. The proposed road is surrounded by irrigation land with clay soil. Hence it is necessary to remove the top layer of clay soil to an average depth at 2 feet as per the design submitted by the consultant and also during rainy season the stagnation of water is very high in that area. Hence, providing toe wall and storm water drainage to the entire road length is necessary to prevent percolation of water in the proposed road and to avoid road damages.
- The Commissioner of Municipal Administration has recommended the proposal for sanction of fund of Rs. 21.12 Crore under Infrastructure and Amenities fund.

> The above proposal was placed before the 16th state Infrastructure and Amenities Promotion Committee meeting held on 14.02.2018 vide agenda no.4 and the committee decided as follows:

"The Committee discussed in detail and decided to recommend to Government for sanction Rs.21.12 crore from Infrastructure and Amenities fund for formation of link road from Karur railway station to NH-7 as it provides an alternate route and eases traffic. Local contribution in the form of land is also available."

3. The Commissioner of Town and Country Planning has therefore requested for sanction of fund to a tune of Rs. 21.12 crore under Infrastructure and Amenities fund for formation of link road from Karur Railway Station to National Highway-7.

4. In the letter second read above, the Commissioner of Municipal Administration has stated that since action is being taken by the District Collector, Karur to determine the value of land to be acquired under this scheme, the cost of land to be acquired may exceed the present value of land i.e., Rs.3.12 crore. Hence, the Commissioner of Municipal Administration has requested Administrative sanction to meet out the excess cost of land to be acquired, from the Municipality fund or other scheme fund as grant.

5. The Government, after careful examination, accept the proposal of the Commissioner of Town and Country Planning and accord sanction for a sum of Rs.21.12 crore (Rupees Twenty one Crore and Twelve lakh only) under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund for the following Project subject to the condition that necessary approval to be obtained from Government, if the excess cost is to be met from any scheme fund (i.e., over and above the present land cost of Rs.3.12 Crore) :

6. The amount sanctioned in para 5 above shall be debited to the following head of account:-

"2217. Urban Development - 05. Other Urban Development Schemes - 800. Other expenditure - State's Expenditure - KA. Schemes implemented in Urban Local Bodies under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund - 09. Grants in Aid - 02. Grants for Creation of Capital Assets".(DPC : 2217 - 05 - 800 - KA - 09 24)

The expenditure sanctioned in para 6 above shall be adjusted under the following new head of account:-

"2217. Urban Development - 05. Other Urban Development Schemes - State's Expenditure - 902. Deduct - Amount met from Infrastructure Development Fund - JC. Amount met from State Infrastructure and Amenities Fund - 30. Inter Account Transfers. (DPC : 2217 - 05 - 902 - JC - 30 02).

By contra debiting - "J. Reserve funds (b) Reserve Funds not bearing interest - 8229-00. Development and Welfare Funds - 200. Other Development and Welfare Funds - AZ - State Infrastructure and Amenities Fund (DPC 8229-00-200-AZ-0005) - (Outgo).

7. Necessary additional funds will be provided in RE/FMA 2018-2019. Pending provision of funds, the Commissioner of Municipal Administration is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned at para 5 above. This expenditure shall be brought to the notice of Legislature by way of specific inclusion in Supplementary Estimate 2018-2019. The Commissioner of Municipal Administration is requested to include amount sanctioned in para 5 above, while sending budget proposal of RE/FMA 2018-2019 and also requested to send necessary explanatory notes for Supplementary Estimates 2018-2019 to Finance (Municipal Administration and Water Supply Department / BG I / BG II) Department without fail.

8. The Commissioner of Municipal Administration shall furnish a copy of this Government Order along with details of expenditure incurred out of the above funds sanctioned in para 5 above to the Director of Town and Country Planning and the Accountant General (A & E), Chennai for making necessary adjustment entries mentioned in para 6 at the end of Financial Year 2018-2019.

9. This order issues with the concurrence of the Finance Department vide its U.O.No.47705/MAWS/2018, dated 03.10.2018 and Additional Sanction Ledger No.1467 (One thousand four hundred and sixty seven).


