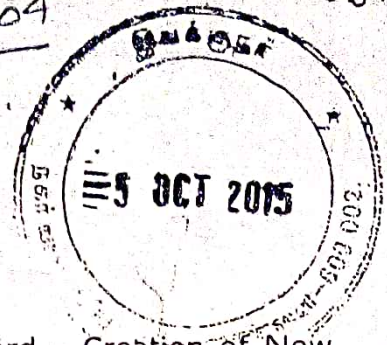

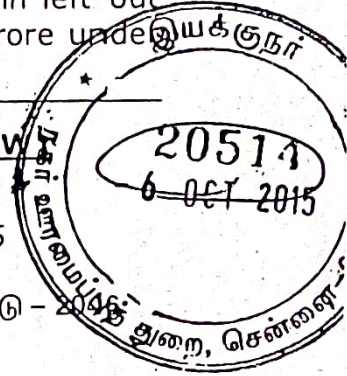

ORDER:

The Director of Town and Country Planning in his letter second read above has stated that the Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board in his letter first read above, has proposed for the work of "Creation of New Infrastructure Assets by providing water mains and feeder mains in left out streets in old city and added areas" for improvement in water supply in core city and added areas for a length of 310.12 Kilometers, due to the following reasons:-

- Consequent on the inclusion of 42 adjacent local bodies within the Chennai Corporation limits, the operational area of the Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board has increased from 174 square kilometers to 426 square kilometers.
- The Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board is currently operating its services through 15 Area Offices and 200 Depot Offices.
- At present, the Board supplies about 587 Million Liters Per Day (MLD) to domestic consumers in the City area and about 45 MLD of water to bulk consumers such as adjacent local bodies and industries located in Chennai Metropolitan area.



- The water is distributed through 16 Water Distribution stations and the total length of distribution water mains is about 4447 kilometer.
- Rapid urbanization, high population and merging of added areas to Chennai city has resulted in sharp increase in water demand.
- Therefore, in order to improve the water supply in these locations and also in added areas a proposal has been formulated for laying new feeder water mains and providing new water mains in left out streets.

2. The Director of Town and Country Planning has further stated that a Detailed Project Report (DPR) has been prepared for Rs.120.37 crore for the above work, by the Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board, which will improve the water supply position in the Areas of Kodungaiyur, Erukkancherry, MKB Nagar, Old and New Washermenpet, Tondiarpet, Royapuram, Perambur, Vyasarpadi, Ambattur, Mogappair, Anna Nagar, Kilpauk, Villivakkam, Ayanavaram, Egmore, Chetpet, Thousand lights, Nungambakkam, Mylapore, Foreshore Estate, Vadapalani, T.Nagar, Arumbakkam and Velachery.

3. The Director of Town and Country Planning has informed that, the subject was placed before the 13th meeting of the Infrastructure and Amenities Promotion Committee Meeting held on 6.11.2014 as agenda item No.9 and the Committee decided as follows:-

"The Committee approved the proposal subject to the following conditions viz.,

1. The DPR prepared for creation of new infrastructure assets by laying new pipelines for water supply in eight areas have to be vetted by an independent consultant.
2. The adequacy of the new proposed water main while replacing the existing old water main, considering the present population and future growth."

4. The Director of Town and Country Planning has requested the orders of the Government to allocate an amount of Rs.120.37 crore under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund, for carrying out the work of "Creation of New Infrastructure Assets by providing water mains and feeder mains in left out streets in old city and added areas", by the Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board.

5. The Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply Board in his letter third read above has stated a consultant was engaged for proof checking of the DPR and after proof checking the revised DPR cost works out to Rs.116.0352 crore. The Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board has therefore requested necessary Sanction for the above project, at an estimated cost of Rs.116.0352 crore.

6. The Government after careful examination of the above proposal have decided to accept the same and sanction an amount of Rs.116,03,52000/- (Rupees One Hundred and Sixteen Crore Three Lakh and Fifty Two Thousand only) under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund to the Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board, for carrying out the

work of "Creation of New Infrastructure Assets by providing water mains and feeder mains in left out streets in old city and added areas", for improvement in water supply in core city and added areas for a length of 310.12 Kilometers, subject to the following conditions that (i) the Detailed Project Report prepared for creation of new infrastructure assets by laying new pipelines for water supply in eight areas have to be vetted by an independent consultant and (ii) the adequacy of the new proposed water main while replacing the existing old water main considering the present population and future growth.

7. The amount sanctioned in paragraph-6 above shall be debited to the following head of account:-

"2217 - Urban development - 05. Other urban Development Schemes - 800. Other Expenditure - Schemes in Twelfth Five year plan - II - State Plan - JR. Assistance to Schemes implemented by Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board from Infrastructure and Amenities Fund - 09. Grants in Aid - 02. Grants for Creation for Capital Assets".
(DPC: 2217 - 05 - 800 - JR - 0921)

8. The above expenditure shall be adjusted by deducting under the following head of account:-

2217 - Urban development - 05 - Other Urban Development Schemes - 902 - Deduct - Amount met from Infrastructure Development Fund - JB. Amount met from State Infrastructure and Amenities Fund - 30. Inter Account Transfers (DPC: 2217 - 05 - 902 - JB - 3004) by contra debiting from, "J. Reserve funds (b) Reserve Funds not bearing interest - 8229 - 00. Development and Welfare Fund - 200 . Other Development and Welfare Fund - AZ, State Infrastructure and Amenities Fund"
(DPC: 8229 - 00 - 200 - AZ - 0005) outgo.

9. The expenditure sanctioned in para - 6 above shall constitute a "New Service". The expenditure shall be brought to the specific notice of the Legislature for approval in due course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure may be initially met by drawal of an advance from the Contingency Fund. The *Director of Town and Country Planning* is directed to calculate the actual amount required for the period upto next supplementary estimates and apply for sanction of the same as advance from the Contingency Fund to finance (B.G.I) Department directly in Form 'A' appended to the Tamil Nadu Contingency Fund Rules, 1963 along with a copy of this order. Orders for sanction of an advance from the Contingency Fund will be issued from Finance (B.G.I) Department. The *Director of Town and Country Planning* is requested to send necessary proposal to include this expenditure in **2015-16** Supplementary Estimates, without fail.

10. The Accountant General, Chennai - 18, is requested to make necessary adjustments at the end of the financial year 2015-2016.

11. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O.No.48050/Finance (Housing)/2015, dated 9.9.2015 with ASL No.945 (Nine Hundred and Fourty Five).
