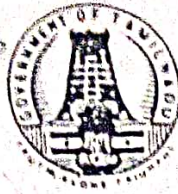


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ABSTRACT



Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board – Plugging of sewage outfalls (158) and strengthening of existing sewerage system in Chennai City under Phase – II – A sum of Rs.163 crores allotted for the above scheme under State "Infrastructure & Amenities Fund" – Rs.30 crores for the year 2014-15 – Sanctioned - Orders - Issued.

ORDER:

The Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board, in the letter second read above has stated that rapid urbanization is throwing up several challenges and the Chennai City is expanding vertically. The individual houses are being converted into multistoried buildings with several dwelling units. Though the erstwhile Chennai city is fully covered with sewerage system, a portion of the untreated sewage find its way into the water ways due to the malfunctioning of the system and capacity constraints of sewers. All the waterways within Chennai City have been perambulated and a total of 337 number of sewage outfalls have now been identified. Among them, there are 105 sewage outfalls in cooum river, 183 sewage outfalls in Buckingham canal and 49 sewage outfalls in Adyar basin.

2. In the Budget 2012-2013 among others, an announcement was made that Government has proposed to plug 337 outfalls to prevent untreated sewage from entering into the Chennai City waterways and to treat this sewage before letting it out, at a cost of Rs.300.00 Crore.

3. The Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board has stated that an action plan has been formulated to prevent flow of untreated sewage into waterways and also to plug all 337 number of sewage outfalls into these waterways by strengthening the existing sewerage

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system. The improvements to the sewerage system are classified into different categories namely;

- 1) Enlargement of sewage pumping main,
- 2) Construction of roadside pumping stations,
- 3) Improvements to existing pumping stations,
- 4) Enlargement of gravity sewage mains and
- 5) Laying of new gravity sewers

4. In the Government Order 1st read above, an amount of Rs.150.00 crore has been sanctioned under Infrastructure and Amenities (I&A) fund for carrying out the plugging of 179 sewage outfalls of 337 outfalls as phase-I, to prevent untreated sewage from entering into Chennai City waterways and to treat this sewage before letting it out into the Chennai city waterways.

5. The Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board has stated that in the 2nd phase, a Detailed Project Report (DPR) has been prepared for Rs.163.00 crores to plug the remaining 158 (337-179) sewage outfalls in Chennai City water ways by way of strengthening the existing sewerage system. The Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board has therefore requested the Member Secretary, State Infrastructure and Amenities Promotion Committee / Commissioner of Town and Country Planning to allocate funds for the above project from the funds available under Infrastructure and Amenities fund to meet the following expenditure anticipated for this project.

6. The Commissioner of Town and Country Planning in the letter third read above, has stated that the above subject was placed before the 12th meeting of the State Infrastructure and Amenities Promotion Committee held on 04.03.2014 and the committee has decided as follows:-

“The Committee decided to recommend to Government for sanction of Rs.163.00 crore from Infrastructure and Amenities fund for plugging of sewage outfalls and strengthening of existing sewerage system in Chennai city waterways by Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board.”

7. The Commissioner of Town and Country Planning has therefore requested the Government to sanction an amount of Rs.163.00 crores under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund, for the proposed plugging of sewage outfalls (158) and strengthening of existing sewerage system in Chennai City under Phase-II, as shown below:-

8. The Government after careful examination, decided to accept the proposal of the Commissioner of Town and Country Planning and accordingly to allocate an amount of Rs. 163 crores under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund to Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board as detailed at paragraph-7 above, for plugging 158 sewage outfalls and strengthening of existing sewerage system in Chennai City under Phase-II and also sanction an amount of Rs. 30 crores (Rupees thirty crores only) for the financial year 2014-15 under Infrastructure and Amenities Fund to CMWSS Board for the above said project.

9. The amount sanctioned in paragraph-8 above shall be debited to the following head of account:-

"2217 - Urban development - 05. Other urban Development Schemes - 800. Other Expenditure - Schemes in Twelfth Five year plan - II - State Plan - JR. Assistance to Schemes implemented by Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board from Infrastructure and Amenities Fund - 09. Grants in Aid - 02. Grants for Capital Expenditure".

(DPC: 2217 - 05 - 800 - JR - 0921)

10. The above expenditure shall be adjusted by deducting under following head of account:-

2217 - Urban development - 05 - Other Urban Development Schemes - 902 - Deduct - Amount met from Infrastructure Development Fund - JB. Amount met from State Infrastructure and Amenities Fund - 30. Inter Account Transfers (DPC: 2217 - 05 - 902 - JB - 3004) by contra debiting from, "J. Reserve funds (b) Reserve Funds not bearing interest - 8229 - 00. Development and Welfare Fund - 200 . Other Development and Welfare Fund - AZ, State Infrastructure and Amenities Fund" (DPC: 8229 - 00 - 200 - AZ - 0005) outgo.

11. Necessary funds will be provided in Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2014-15. Pending provision of funds in Revised Estimate / Final Modified Appropriation 2014-15, the Commissioner of Town and Country Planning is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned in Paragraph 8 above by means of Account Payee Cheque in favour of the Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board, so as to deposit the amount in Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board's Personal Deposit Account No.6184513255. This shall be brought to the notice of the Legislature by Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2014-2015.

12. The Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board is directed to include the expenditure sanctioned above, while sending the budget proposals for Revised Estimate /Final Modified Appropriation 2014-15 and also to send necessary Explanatory Notes through Commissioner of Town and Country Planning for including the above expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates 2014-2015 to Finance (BG-I) Department without fail.

13. The Managing Director, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board is also directed to send necessary proposals to Government through Commissioner of Town and Country Planning at the appropriate time, for sanction of funds for the above project for the financial years 2015-16 and 2016-17, as detailed at para-7 above.

14. The Accountant General, Chennai – 18, is requested to make necessary adjustments at the end of the financial year 2014-2015.
