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1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 BACKGROUND OF THE STUDY

A master plan is created for towns and cities that places an emphasis on zoning laws to ensure the wise use of urban land. As a result, a master plan is an important development strategy that allocates property for various land uses, including residential, commercial, industrial, public and semi-public, traffic and transportation, parks, play areas, and open space, while also taking into account the current land uses. The plans will identify problematic areas for traffic and transportation, locations for schools and recreation centres, etc. in addition to advocating broader land use limits. They will also consider providing infrastructure facilities based on the area's predicted population. To undertake these tasks, programmes are developed and financing sources are found.

The Geographic Information System (GIS) allows for the creation, management, and analysis of all types of spatial and geographical data (GIS). Data can be stored, updated, retrieved, analyzed, and displayed by the system. It efficiently and affordably completes the plan preparation.

The 20-year master plan for Jayamkondam will take into account the diverse needs of the anticipated population. This report includes topics including data collection and review, supply and demand analysis, gap analysis in service delivery, assessment of environmental conditions, traffic analysis, preparation of existing land use, and issue identification using GIS software.

1.2 <u>VISION</u>

In order to improve everyone's quality of life, especially that of the poor, essentialcivicamenities including Water supply, sewerage, urban transportation, and parks should all be given as necessary civic amenities to enhance everyone's quality of life, especially that of the poor. Building infrastructure effectively helps the general public get the better services and the development of industrial sectors, creating job possibilities for everyone.

1.3 OBJECTIVES OF MASTER PLAN

- 1. Ensure that every household provides all basic infrastructure from local administration, such as water supply, sewerage connection, and solid waste disposal.
- 2. The town's amenity value can be increased by establishing and reserving greenery and open spaces (e.g. parks).

3. Use public transportation to get around all of the residential neighborhoods. (For example, a battery bus or a minibus).

4. To protect outmigration and provide better employment opportunities, increasing non-polluting industries in and around town is a good idea.

2. ABOUT JAYAMKONDAM LOCAL PLANNING AREA

The Jayamkondam single Local Planning Area was first declared under subsection (4) of section 10 of the Tamil Nadu Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, and published in Part II, section 2 of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette, No: 29, Page no. 412, dated 20th July, 2016. The Jayamkondam Municipality is the primary constituent of the Jayamkondam Local Planning Area which had a 23.17 sq. km. and 33,945 residents living there as of the 2011 Census.

In 2004, Jayamkondam Town Panchayat was established as a municipality, and in 2010 it was promoted to a second-class municipality. The Jayamkondam Municipality is comprised of 21 wards and covers a total area of about 28.49 square kilometres. The profile of Jayamkondam Town is presented in Tables 1.1 and 1.2.

Since there haven't been any significant changes to institutional and industrial use in or near the municipality in the last 10 years. It was noted both during a reconnaissance assessment conducted in the first week of February 2022 and in accordance with a letter from the head office via Roc. No. 10100/2021/TCP-2 on March 4, 2022.

According to 2011, census population of Jayamkondam municipal area is 33945 which is categorized as small town as per URDPFI guideline.

2.1 <u>History of Development</u>

Mohamed Ali annexed the two palayams of Ariyalur and Udayarpalayam located within the present Ariyalur District on the grounds of default in payment of Tributes and failure to assist him in quelling the rebellion of Yusuf Khan. In November 1764, Mohamed Ali represented the issue to Madras Council and obtained military assistance on 3rd January 1765. The forces led by Umdat-Ul-Umara and Donald Campbell entered Ariyalur and captured it. The young Poligar together with his followers, there upon fled to Udayarpalayam. On the 19th of January, the army marched upon Udayarpalayam. The Poligar's troops were defeated and the palayams were occupied. The two poligars fled their town and took refuge in Tharangampadi, then a Danish Settlement. The annexation of the palayam gave the Navab uninterrupted possession of all his territories extending Arcot to Tiruchirappalli.

The history followed was a power struggle between Hyder Ali and later Thippu Sultan with the British. After the death of Thippu Sultan, the British took the civil and military Administration of the Carnatic in 1801. Thus Tiruchirappalli came in to the hands of the English and the District was formed in 1801. In 1995 Tiruchirappalli was trifurcated and the new Perambalur and Karur districts were formed.

2.2 ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP

As per Government G.O.MS.No.657 Revenue (Ra-1(1)) Department, dated 29.12.2000, Ariyalur district was formed from the composite Perambalur district which was trifurcated from Tiruchirappalli district in 1995. Ariyalur district was declared as a separate district from 01.01.2001.

Subsequently, by Government Orders (Ms) No.167, Revenue, dated. 19.04.2002 and G.O (Ms) No.168, Revenue, dated. 19.04.2002, Perambalur and Ariyalur districts were merged into one as Perambalur district with headquarters at Perambalur.

The Government of Tamil Nadu, in G.O.Ms.No.683 Revenue RA1 (1) Department, dated 19.11.2007 issued a order that Perambalur district will be bifurcated into two districts, i.e., Perambalur district with headquarters at Perambalur and Ariyalur district with headquarters at Ariyalur. The Ariyalur district has again formed as a separate district since 23.11.2007.

2.3 <u>REGIONAL CONTEXT</u>

Jayamkondam was originally known as Nellimanagramam until King Rajendracholan changed its name to Jayankondacholapuram. Jayamkondam was declared as a town panchayat during the British era.

Jayamkondam city is located in the east of the Ariyalur district of Tamiladu. Greater geographic advantages are provided for the growth and development of the Jayamkondam town and its surroundings by the layout and placement of towns in the Jayamkondam region. As a result, the Town benefits from its proximity to its neighbours (Table 2.1). This provides the town with better miles for movement when it comes to trade, commerce, business, and other tertiary sector operations. Huge lignite reserves have been discovered nearby, and the Neyveli Lignite Corporation has started power projects as the town's primary economic activity. In the area of this town, there are more than 25 temples from various historical eras.

The distance from Chidambaram to the revered holy town of ThillaiNatarajar, home of the temple, and the famed Annamalai University, one of India's major public residential universities, is only 50 kilometres. The Pitchavaram Wetland, which is close to Chidambaram, is home to the second-largest mangrove in the world. The convenience to Chidambaram encourages the development of Jayamkondam's tourist infrastructure.

The following towns surround the town of Jayamkondam: Virudhachalam to the north, Chidambaram to the east, Ariyalur to the west, and Kumbakonam to the south.



The Towns are listed in Table 2.1 along with their distances from Jayamkondam. Tiruchirapalli, which is 98 kilometres away and southwest of Jayamkondam town, is the closest metropolitan city.

The closest coastal town is Karaikal, which lies southeast of the town.

2.4 EVOLUTION OF GROWTH IN JAYAMKONDAM

Agriculture is the key factor driving Jayamkondam's growth pattern. The proximity of significant pilgrimage sites serves as the primary impetus for the growth. In the 11th century, RajendraChola-I built the ArulmiguGangaikondaCholaswarer Temple, which is located in the village of GangaikondaCholapuram. The distance between here and Jayamkondam is ten kilometres. Tamil Nadu's historical and cultural legacy. ASI and HR & CE are in charge of it at the moment, and UNESCO just recognized the temple as a World Heritage Site.

Since NH-81 and SH-140connect Jayamkondam Town, there have been business developments on both the National Highway and the State Highway.

2.5 GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION

Jayamkondam is located at 11.212° latitude and 79.365° longitude. It is a historic town in the Ariyalur district. The administrative centre of the Udaiyarpalayam Taluk is Jayamkondam. The state capital of Chennai, a sizeable metropolis that is only 270 kilometres away from Jayamkondam.

Jayamkondam has numerous interconnected roads. The National highway (NH-81) that runs 321.4 kilometres between Chidambaram and Coimbatore passes through this town. The State highway SH-140, which connects Virudachalam and Kumbakonam and is 48.6 kilometres long, passes via Jayamkondam to get to this town. Kumbakonam may be reached from Jayamkondam in the south at a distance of roughly 29 kilometres by using the Neelathanallur-Mathanathur Bridge. Ariyalur is located 38 kilometres to the west. Viruthachalam is located 36 kilometres to the north and 50kilometres east of Chidambaram.

2.6 PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS

Topography and Soil

The surrounding area is rich in mineral resources, including lignite beds that are similar to red soil and red soil in general. No river flows through the town.

Climate and Rainfall

The Ariyalur district does not have an extreme climate, however the summers there can be rather hot with a moderate temperature range between the maximum and minimum. With a temperature of 39°C, April is the hottest month and 18.8°C, February is the coldest.

The South West Monsoon begins in June and lasts until September. Summer rains are rare. October is when the North East monsoon begins and lasts through December. Compared to the North East Monsoon, the South West Monsoon has significantly less rainfall.




Fig.2 Mean Temperature & Precipitation in Ariyalur District

2.7 TRANSPORT NETWORK

On the Tiruchirappalli-Chidambaram National Highway (NH-81), Jayamkondam is an important road intersection. The Jayamkonam LPA has excellent access to the road network. Major surrounding towns like Ariyalur, Virudhachalam, Kumbakonam, and Chidambaram as well as metropolitan area like Tiruchirapalli is connected to the Jeyamkondam town via roads.

The town of Jayamkondam has no rail connections to the railroads. The closest railway connection to Jayamkondam is Kumbakonam Railway Station (30 km).and Ariyalur railway station is 38Km.

3. OUR APPROACH AND METHODOLOGY

3.1 OBJECTIVES

The following objectives have been identified for the Jayamkondam Single Local Planning Area's comprehensive urban planning process using GIS technology.

- To predict the population and land needs for the year 2041 using statistical techniques and augmented with data from the surrounding area.
- To create thematic maps including land use, geomorphology, lithology, geology, slope, natural hazards, potential groundwater resources, transportation, soil, drainage, and administrative boundaries for the entire Jayamkondam Planning Area utilizing remote sensing and auxiliary data.
- To prepare an urban land use suitability map for the planning area using a multi-criteria weighted-index approach.
- To incorporate environmental sensitivity and urban land use suitability when allocating land uses for urban development, such as transportation, industrial, commercial, and residential, and to design a land use plan for the upcoming year.
- To overlaid the land use plan and thematic maps created from satellite data with the cadastral information received from available field data.
- Waterfronts are settlements, civilizations or commercial developments that come up along water bodies like rivers, coastal regions or lakes, acting as lifelines for development of urban area. The economic and historical significance of many a city speaks of the glorious waters flowing through it. The waterfronts have the potential to become the cultural and heritage hubs of this urban area that lie on the bank of the rivers/water area and attract people from the urban community and also tourists to spend time. Thus, waterfronts have emerged as the lively urban area.

• The creation of waterfront is considered as a better commercial idea for transforming urban area into a booming centre of tourism, culture, leisure and business. Importantly it will act as ground water recharge area.

- Integral design approach is the key for successful execution of urban road projects, especially to make roads accessible to all road users for all season and to enhance the local cultural appeal of the cities.
- Creating a sanitation benchmark framework and water supply for every household which can be used by ULBs to develop a database and registry of certified onsite sanitation system, and a robust reporting format.
- To provide improved employment opportunities and protect outmigration. According to URDPFI guidelines, Jayamkondam town is classified as a small town more than 1% of the land area in the town is projected for industrial uses. Also this town is 50 kilometres distant from Neyveli Lignite Corporation (NLC).

The study used cadastral maps of the entire Jayamkondam Local Planning Area (Municipality) displaying the boundaries with survey numbers.



3.4 <u>SPATIAL ANALYSIS METHOD</u>

- Spatial analysis can be done using various techniques with the aid of statistic and geographical information systems (GIS).
- A GIS facilitates attribute interaction with geographical data in order to enhance interpretation accuracy and prediction of spatial analysis.
- The spatial analysis that is involved in GIS can build geographical data and the resulting information will be more informative than unorganized collected data. According to the requirement of end user, a suitable geospatial technique is chosen to be implemented with GIS.
- This selection of the geospatial technique will define the classification and method of analysis to be used.

4. APPROACHES OVER SECTORAL DATA

4.1 IDENTIFICATION OF TOWN

As per 2011 census Jayamkondam town population is 33945, According to URDPFI guidelines classified as a small town, This town is 50 kilometres distant from Neyveli Lignite Corporation (NLC) The main economic activity of the town is Cashewnut industries, Oil Mills, Handloom textiles, trade and commerce etc.,

Jayamkondam is one of old town in Ariyalur district and as a heritage value i,e.Gangaikonda Chozhapuram temple. This temple was constructed during 11th Century as per literature.


