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With reference to the Government letter 1<sup>st</sup> cited, regarding the above subject, the TNGG has been issued relating to the Amendment of Town and Country Planning Act 1971 in Sec(50). Every permission shall have validity of 3 years has been amended as 5 years. The copy of TNGG has been sent through this office letter 3<sup>rd</sup> cited.

In this regard, Number of queries and request have been received by CMDA for clarification on the applicability of the Act provision in respect of cases in which the planning permission was issued before 30.3.2017.


In view of the above, the following Resolution resolved in 255<sup>th</sup> CMDA meeting held on 21.04.2017. The same resolutions can be adopted for Directorate of Town and Country Planning Jurisdiction also.

**Resolution:**

The applicability of Act provision making the validity period from 3 to 5 years shall be extended for the following cases.

- (i) All the planning permission issued with the 3 years validity period which will be expiring on or after 30.03.2017.
- (ii) Application received for the renewal of planning permission and under examination by CMDA/Local body as on 30.3.2017.
